Football is the most popular sport in Uzbekistan, which gained independence in 1991. The national association participates in all competitions held by FIFA and the Asian Football Confederation. The main governing body of Uzbek football is the Football Association of Uzbekistan, founded in 1946.

Football is one of the oldest games. According to the British, playing football with feet was very popular in the British Isles as early as the 9th century.

On October 26, 1863, during the founding of the English Football Association in London, the first official rules of this game, consisting of 13 articles, were approved. Later, these rules became the basis of the football game for all other national associations. Modern football appeared in Uzbekistan at the beginning of the last century and quickly became a popular game. The places of its development were Fergana, Tashkent, Andijan, Kokan and Samarkand. They played football for the first time in the city of Fergana. In the same place, at the end of 1911, the first football team was formed. In August 1912, the number of football teams formed in Fergana allowed to unite into "Football Team". After a while, they started playing football in Tashkent. TOLS is the most popular team among football fans from Tashkent. In recent years, taking care of the health of our people, forming a mentally and physically mature generation, attracting the population, especially young people, to football, a sport that is played by millions and has a special place in our country. a number of measures are being implemented. At the same time, today in our country, the selection of highly talented young players, the further development of the selection system and football infrastructure, raising the activity of football sports schools to a new level, training specialists in the field and financially motivating them issues such as improving the incentive system, raising the level of the competitions held, remain one of the urgent tasks. To make football the most popular sport among the population in Uzbekistan, to establish a system of selecting, selecting and training young players with high talent and training them as professional athletes, to bring the country's football to a level where it can compete with developed countries, training of football specialists based on international requirements and standards, development of football club activities, effective organization of the training process for national teams, major international football competitions in our country, including teenagers, youth and women a number of decisions and laws were created in order to hold world and continental championships among girls' teams. The Ministry of Physical Education and Sports of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Ministry of Public Education, the Ministry of Higher and Secondary Special Education, the National Olympic Committee of

Uzbekistan and the Football Association of Uzbekistan have identified the following as the main directions for the development of professional football in the Republic of Uzbekistan the proposal to determine was approved. Increasing the interest of children and teenagers in playing football, popularizing amateur football, regularly organizing football competitions in secondary schools, other educational institutions, neighborhoods and organizations in this regard, selecting and qualifying young players with high talent. to fundamentally improve the system of receiving football players, to establish a system of "exporting football players" to the leading clubs of countries with developing football by gradually providing them with professional training, to attract and encourage private investments in the field of football, management of the field on the basis of market mechanisms, transfer of football clubs to the private sector, and an environment of healthy sports competition was created among them. "Uzbek football" school was created by increasing the viewership of football competitions and effectively establishing a new system of football development. Advanced scientific-methodical and innovative technologies were introduced for the training, retraining, upgrading, selection and development of qualified specialists in the field of football. Further improvement of the normative and legal framework in the field of football, material and technical improvement of football infrastructure and adaptation to international requirements were made. A single electronic database of general information about football players operating throughout our country has been established. With the help of this electronic database, which consists of a special program, the activities of the players are monitored and monitored. It collects and registers information about professional and young football players of all ages of the Republic. In 2002-2003, the players of the youth national team of Uzbekistan achieved great success. After defeating the national team of Tabiland in Qatar 4:0, Qatar 5:4, and then losing to South Korea 0:2, our players reached the quarter finals, where they defeated Syrian Arabia 4:0. Uzbek players met the Japanese national team in the semi-finals. The main time of the intense and heated match ended with a score of 1:1. In 11-meter shots, the Japanese were a little better and won 4:2. The youth national team of Uzbekistan, which took the fourth place, won the opportunity to play among the 16 strongest teams in the world. The World Championship was held in the United Arab Emirates in December 2003. The players of Uzbekistan played a beautiful and cooperative game, but they could not reach the 1/8 finals. However, experts and fans have a high regard for the game of the national team of Uzbekistan. In three matches, they fought against their peers, but with the score of 2:3 against Mali (African champion), 1:2 against Argentina (also world champion), and 0:1 against Spain (European champion). they lost the victory. In recent years, the national team of Uzbekistan, youth and junior national teams have been participating positively in all World Championships. In 2010, our national team took an honorable 2nd place in the Asian Youth Championship in Tashkent and qualified for the World Championship. In 2011, our national team took 4th place at the Asian Championship held in Qatar. In 2011, for the first time in Uzbekistan, the "Nasaf" team became the owner of the Asian Cup. In 2011, they entered the ranks of the top eight teams at the World Youth Championship held in Mexico. In 2012, our national team won first place in the Asian Youth Championship held in Iran and qualified for the World Championship. In 2013, at the World Youth Championship held in Turkey, he repeated the result of the previous World Championship and entered the top eight.
