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STROKES TO THE PSYCHOLOGICAL PORTRAIT OF ZOSIMA IN THE NOVEL BY F.M. DOSTOEVSKY'S "THE BROTHERS KARAMAZOV"

Let's consider how the archetype, psychotype and monologue of consciousness help reveal the image of this character. Archetype in the image of Zosima

The archetype of the sage - Zosima appears in the novel as an old man, a righteous and wise mentor with deep knowledge of spiritual life and human nature. He represents the image of a wise mentor who instills moral lessons and philosophical truths in the heroes and readers. The sage archetype helps to express the depth of his character and philosophical views on the world [4; With. 20-23, p. 30-40].

Psychotype in the image of Zosima and how he reveals it.

The study of literary characters through the prism of psychotypology is an interesting study. The Zosima psychotype is characterized by deep spiritual insight and a high moral standard. He represents the image of a spiritual guide, humble and wise, with a deep sense of compassion and understanding of human nature. There is harmony and spiritual nobility in his character, which make him one of the most sublime characters in the novel. This is a personality type that characterizes the basic traits of a person's character and behavior. Zosima can be described as an idealistic and spiritually developed person who strives for harmony with himself and the world around him. He has high empathy and the ability to understand other people, making him an invaluable advisor and support to other characters.

To fully analyze the character's psychotype, we will use a methodology based on the study of his characterological traits, behavioral manifestations and motivational characteristics, as well as contextual analysis of his interaction with other characters in the novel and text analysis. The character of Zosima represents a type of character that can be defined as a Mentor. He has the following characteristics characteristic of this psychotype:

1. Wisdom and spiritual knowledge

Zosima is an elder with deep knowledge and understanding of spiritual laws. His advice and instructions are filled with wisdom and philosophical reflections.

2. Humility and compassion

His character contains a high degree of humility and compassion for others. He is always ready to listen and help others without towering over them.

3. Moral principles

Zosima is guided by high moral principles and a sense of duty to society. He is a model of spiritual purity and moral nobility.

4. Training and mentoring

He takes on the role of mentor and teacher for the young heroes of the novel, passing on spiritual truths to them and helping them develop spiritually..

Analysis of Zosima's psychotype allows us to see his important role in the novel The Brothers Karamazov. As a Mentor, he not only fills the work with deep philosophical thoughts, but also serves as an example of spiritual integrity and moral purity. His image is an important element of the moral and spiritual fabric of the novel, reminding readers of the value of spiritual development and lofty ideals.

In accordance with the classification of accentuations by A.E. Lichko, Zosim shows signs of several types of accentuations, but the most significant are the following:

1. Hyperthymic type - Zosim is characterized by optimism, high levels of energy and activity. He always finds internal resources to maintain spiritual strength and motivation both for himself and for those around him. His confidence in himself and his mission helps him be an authority figure for other characters.

2. Exalted type - Zosim has high emotional sensitivity and the ability to experience deeply. His religious faith and spiritual convictions often lead him to speak passionately and sublimely about faith and human duty. This makes him not only a spiritual leader, but also a moral authority for other characters [2].

Zosim is a complex character whose personality contains elements of various types of accentuations, including hyperthymic, schizoid and exalted types. His unique traits make him

one of the most memorable characters in literature and provide ample material for psychological analysis and interpretation.

Revealing the image of Zosima through a monologue of consciousness. One of the methods by which the author reveals the image of Zosimus is a monologue of consciousness.

For analysis, we used text fragments containing monologues of Zosima's consciousness, in which he shares his thoughts, beliefs and inner world. We analyzed these fragments from the point of view of their influence on the character of Zosimus and his role in the novel [3].

1. Wisdom and spirituality: in the monologues of Zosima's consciousness, his deep wisdom and spirituality are manifested. He discusses the importance of love, forgiveness and compassion, emphasizing the importance of these values for a person's spiritual development.
