That's because they're starting to be given more "discipline" by the Internet or cell phone than by parents. We need to develop with national identity, preserving love, and building a unique democratic society on a national basis! To do this, today's young:

In order for a modern, knowledgeable, in short, perfect generation, the calls written after each goal do not hit progress, but only in those who seek progress.

In recent times, in addition to high-tech professionals, the term "arrogance" has been frequently spoken on the side of sociologists. Some experts also do not hide the fact that information broadcasts over the Internet observed in many countries today are worried that cyberbullying could be a manifestation. Is there actually a high level of this risk? What is the scope of the work being done to prevent it, and are they really bearing fruit?

At a time when high-tech technology is gaining more and more meaning in our lives today, there is no need to emphasize too much that the issue of Internet security is of relevance. Therefore, the first steps to training in safe networking activities are admondictfully adopted in countries. Butundunyo Internet Security Day will be held under the direction of Viven Reding, commissioner of the European Commission for Information Society and MEDIA. To date, 89 organizations from 33 countries around the world, including 17 ministries and administrative departments, have participated in the event, asking for more than 300 national, regional, and local events. A number of them have educational content, the purpose of which is to introduce the general public to methods of solving Internet security problems.

Another of the biggest threats in today's cyberattack, experts say, are various programs that serve outrageous purposes, which in many cases use personal information for various fraudulent purposes, in particular with the intention of spreading "spam" applications and organizing cyberattacks. According to Kaspersky Laboratory, in 2010 alone, 580 million cameras were organized through browsers in Russia (compared with no more than 73 million in 2009). In addition, according to Symantec, the number of computers affected by viruses is increasing around the world, and they, in turn, are distributing even more "spam" and malicious software products.

At first, visitors around the world and well-educated people fought for freedom of information. Later, his power began to be used for various social and political purposes. Today, all humanity suffers from an over-the-sheer amount of information. The latest and most perfect form of information that has the power to take over unarmed is undoubtedly the Internet.

The Internet was originally created for scientific research and military purposes. (Matthew 24:14; 28:19, 20) Today, humanity has become a source of information that has not yet been fully studied, rich in mysteries, and without limits. However, the Internet is not a three-headed dragon, it is just another invention of mankind. It's strange that he comes into our lives, changes our daily lives, our attitudes. When you argue over the Internet, relationships are simply in the form of a game. It doesn't look like a real relationship with us at all. What kind of conversation did it have that could end with a single act of mouse!? The first clinics to treat people on the Internet began working a foreign country, especially in Russia. In America, however, psychiatric hospitals were founded in 1996.

First signs of internet browsing:

- 1. stay in the network for a long time;
- 2. use the Internet for no purpose;
- 3. abandon other interests due to the virtual world;
- 4. mood when unable to use the Internet, such as anger.

If your child spends more than 5 hours a day online, then there is sufficient grounds to worry. Fierce fans of the network also experience feeling uncomfortable in the real world, an attempt to hide how long it has been in it, while increasing the tendency to lie and real life slack.

What is the purpose of using the Internet also depends on the nature of man and the environment that surrounds them. People who are quick to get nervous and emotionally motivated are interested in a variety of "shooting games" and press their victories in this way. In the behavior of such individuals, there is a high degree of aggressiveness and reduced risk. Games, in fact, should be psychologically experimented with before they can be sold.

There are many cases of internet browsing a foreign country leading to marriages, family relationships and a breakdown of close friendships. People who spend more time on the Internet than their loved ones are also found. There are even those who can take themselves into the internet's shelter by avoiding punches like laundry, shopping for bread from the store, collecting houses. For example, an American woman was busy with the internet all day and forgot to take her child from school, whose classes had already ended. We can also give a few such examples ourselves, which have a serious impact on the upbringing of our children and young people today. And the fact that the "monster" inside the iron box is being separated from the love we can give to our close people, parents, friends is a matter of desire for serious concern.

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
