A truly educated person is not one who graduated from any, even higher, educational institution! Not someone who has read many, even very many, at least the best books in his lifetime. Not the one who has accumulated in himself, by one means or another, a certain stock, even a very large one, of various knowledge.

This is not the very essence of education.

Socrates said that the soul is nourished, but its food is something incorporeal, since its food is knowledge.

Knowledge is to the intellect what food is to the body, since both these things complement each other and must coexist in a person.
